I would like to thank you for taking the time to meet with Risk Control to discuss the operations of Town of Clayton. This action allows the Risk Control Department to assist your organization and its services in identifying existing and potential liability exposures that may be present in day-to-day operations such as yours.

Upon review of the information gathered and discussed during our meeting, please allow me to offer the following comments and recommendations:

• 2022-06-01 - Playground Equipment Maintenance

Parks and Recreation - PARKS & RECREATION

The play equipment at Depauville Park is residential grade. The Town should consider developing plans for the removal or replacement of this equipment with commercial grade equipment.

• 2022-06-02 - Youth Commission Activity

Parks and Recreation - RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES / SPONSORS – ENTITY OR OUTSIDE ORGANIZATION

It is recommended the Town provide greater oversight into the activities of the Youth Commission. The Town should ensure procedures are in place that address human resource processes to include hiring of volunteers, staff training and policy distribution. The Town should also ensure policies are in place for the Commission that provides operational guidance on youth programs and activities.

• 2022-06-03 - Skate Park - Signed For Rules & Hours

Skate Park - SKATE PARK

Signs stating the rules and hours of the skate park should be posted in a highly visible location. Ensuring that visitors to the skate park are aware of the rules and hours will assist in the event of a claim or should enforcement of the rules be necessary. Additionally, signs stating the safety equipment requirements for using the skate park should be posted. This will assist in ensuring users wear proper protective equipment to aid in avoiding physical injury.
