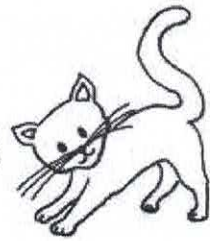


2023 SUMMER RABIES VACCINATION CLINICS



Donation based for Dogs, Cats, Ferrets over 3 months of age
It's New York State Law!

State Health Law says that if an unvaccinated or lapsed vaccinated pet has contact with a potential rabid wild animal, the pet must be euthanized or placed in a 6 month quarantine at owner's expense.

Prevent these issues and protect your family and pets by coming to any clinic listed below.

Even if your pet is strictly an INDOOR pet, it MUST BE VACCINATED against rabies!

- 🐾 **Do not attend clinic if you or your pet is sick**
- 🐾 **Please only minimum people necessary to safely handle pet(s)**
- 🐾 **ALL pets must be securely contained or controlled at ALL times**

- 🐾 NYS Health Law states: *“Every dog, cat and domesticated ferret shall have all initial vaccinations administered **no later than four months** after birth (must be at least 3 months for initial shot). Every dog, cat and domesticated ferret shall have **a second vaccination within one year of the first**”* (if the animal is kept current, the subsequent shots are good for 3 years after the initial 1 year shot)
- 🐾 **If available**, bring a copy of your pet's last certificate of vaccination. Or, bring the following information: Owner's name, 911 address, town of residence, phone, each pet name, weight (over/under 20 lbs), sex, breed, age, and color.
- 🐾 Dogs **MUST BE LEASHED** and cats **MUST BE CONTAINED** in carrier, pillow case, etc.
- 🐾 Public Health suggests a **\$10.00 donation** per animal to assist in defraying free clinic expenses.
