LOCAL LAW NO. ____ OF 2025

CHAPTER 225 - NOISE

§225-1. Purpose.

The purpose of this law is to regulate noise that is loud, excessive and possibly harmful to citizens in the Town of Clayton and outside the Village of Clayton limits. This prohibition is intended to prohibit unreasonable noise by whatever means created or from whatever source.

§ 225-2. General Prohibition and Definitions.

A. General prohibition. The creation of any unreasonably loud, disturbing noise in the Town and outside the boundary of the Village of Clayton is prohibited. Noise of such character, intensity or duration as to endanger public comfort, peace or repose or to be detrimental to the life or health of any individual is declared to be a nuisance, shall constitute unreasonable noise, and is prohibited.

B. Definitions.

<u>AUTHORIZED EMERGENCY VEHICLE</u> — Every ambulance, police vehicle, fire vehicle and civil defense vehicle when on emergency calls.

 $\underline{\mathrm{EMERGENCY}}$ — A public calamity or an exposure of any person or property to imminent danger.

<u>EMERGENCY WARNING DEVICE</u> — Any sound signal device that is designed to be used and is actually used to warn of an emergency.

<u>PERSON</u> — Any individual, partnership, company, corporation, association, firm, organization, or any other group of individuals, or any person or employee thereof.

REAL PROPERTY BOUNDARY — An imaginary line exterior to any structure, along the ground surface, which separates the real property owned by one person from that owned by another person, and the vertical extension of such line.

<u>SOUND REPRODUCTION DEVICE</u> — A device intended primarily for the production or reproduction of sound including, but not limited to, any musical instrument, radio receiver, tape recorder, cd player, phonograph or sound amplification system, and the like.

<u>SOUND SOURCE SITE</u> — Any land under the ownership or control of a person in or upon which one or more sound sources are located. The sound source site includes all individual sound sources that are located on such site, whether stationary, movable or mobile.

<u>UNREASONABLE NOISE</u> — Any excessive or unusually loud sound which either annoys, disturbs, injures, or endangers the comfort, repose, health, peace or safety of a reasonable person of normal sensibilities, or which causes injury to animal or damage to property or business. Standards to be considered in determining whether unreasonable noise exists in a

given situation include, but are not limited to, the following:

- (1) The intensity of the noise.
- (2) Whether the nature of the noise is usual or unusual.
- (3) Whether the origin of the noise is natural or unnatural.
- (4) The intensity of the background noise.
- (5) The proximity of the noise to sleeping facilities.
- (6) The nature and the zoning district of the area within which the noise emanates.
- (7) The time of day or night the noise occurs.
- (8) The duration of the noise.
- (9) Whether the sound source is temporary.
- (10) Whether the noise is continuous or intermittent.
- (11) Whether alternative methods are available to achieve the objectives of the sound-producing activity.
- (12) Specific examples of sounds which may create unreasonable noise are specified hereafter at subsections 3 9.

§225-3. Bells.

No person shall sound or cause to be sounded any bell, except a church bell, in such manner or with such volume as to create unreasonable noise.

§225-4. Amplifiers and Loud Speakers.

- A. No person shall use, operate or maintain, or, being the owner or lessee of any premises, permit the use, maintenance or operation thereon of any radio, phonograph, loudspeaker, amplifier or any like reproducing device in such a manner or with such volume at any time as to create unreasonable noise.
- B. The Town Board may grant permission in writing to any person to reasonably broadcast or amplify in or upon the streets, or other areas, of the Town, and if and when such permission is granted and broadcasting or amplifying is done pursuant to such permission, the same shall not constitute unreasonable noise.

§225-5. Truck Motors.

No person shall permit the motor of a tractor or truck to continue operating while such tractor or truck is not in motion and is standing or parked on any public street or in any public place in any residential zone during the hours between 10:00 p.m. and 6:30 a.m., as to create unreasonable noise.

§225-6. Emergency Warning Devices.

No person shall operate or cause to be operated any emergency warning device, which creates unreasonable noise except:

- A. To give notice as a warning of any emergency.
- B. On an authorized emergency vehicle when such vehicle is engaged in emergency operations provided that such device is not operated to create unnecessary noise or for a period of time longer than is necessary to respond to such emergency.

C. When such device is under test.

§225-7. Exhausts.

No person shall cause or permit the discharge into the open air the exhaust of any device, including but not limited to any diesel engine, internal combustion engine or turbine engine, so as to create unreasonable noise.

§225-8. Sound Reproduction.

No person shall operate, play or permit the operation or playing of any radio, television, phonograph, drum, musical instrument, sound amplifier or similar device which produces, reproduces or amplifies sound:

- A. In such a manner as to create unreasonable noise plainly audible across a real property boundary.
- B. In such a manner as to create unreasonable noise that is plainly audible at 50 feet from such device, when operated in or on a motor vehicle on a public highway.
- C. In such a manner as to create unreasonable noise to any person other than the operator of the device.
- D. In such a manner as to create unreasonable noise that enters an apartment or dwelling unit that is separate and distinct from the apartment or dwelling unit from which the unreasonable noise originated.

The Town Board, or its designee, may issue a permit to authorize sound reproduction upon such conditions as the Board deems appropriate and pursuant to such rules or regulations and fees as promulgated by the Town Board.

§225-9. Squealing Tires.

No person shall operate a motor vehicle in such a manner as to cause unreasonable noise by spinning or squealing the tires of such motor vehicle.

§225-10. Penalties for Offenses.

Any person violating any provision of this chapter shall, upon conviction, be subject to a fine of not less than \$50 nor more than \$250. Each day of continued violation is a separate and distinct offense. The Town Board may also seek injunctive relief from a court of competent jurisdiction against such person.

§225-11. Severability.

If any provision or subsection of this law shall be held to be invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainer of this chapter, but shall be confined to the clause, sentence, or paragraph thereof directly involved in such controversy.

Please find enclosed a Joint Permit Application for the installation of a shore well at the above property. The residence has an existing conventional well that was drilled to 260' but is no longer providing sufficient water for the residence.

The Listemann's existing well was providing sufficient water for the their dwelling until two new dwellings were built in the past 3-4 years in the vicinity of their property (the Brady dwelling and the LaVere/Ramseier dwelling). With these new dwellings in the area, every 4 days the Listemann's well is running out of water and it takes 2-3 days for it to fill it to a usable amount again. They have heard from their neighbors that the newly built dwellings have water storage tanks on their properties and wells that were drilled 300' yet these new dwellings are also experiencing a shortage of water.

As a result of this, it does not seem that drilling their existing well deeper would provide a solution to their water shortage and therefore, this is why we are proposing installing a shore well.

I believe Mr. Doug Rogers has been cc'd in all of the correspondence with the permitting agencies to date, however, if you require any further information, please do not hesitate to contact me.

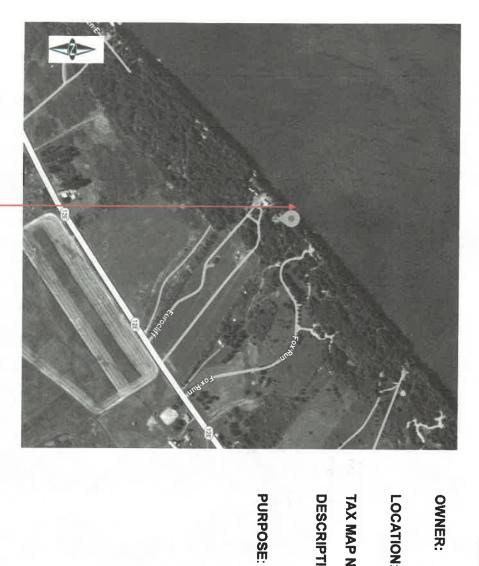
POLICY 2

Facilitate the siting of water dependent uses and facilities on or adjacent to coastal waters.

The site is a waterfront property with approximately 110LF of shoreline. The new shore well will provide access to potable water for a single family dwelling. The shore well is necessary in order for the property owners to access water as a conventional well was previously installed on the property but has since run dry. Therefore, the new shore well will enhance the existing and anticipated residential private uses of the waterfront at this location and provide for an essential source of water.

Furthermore, the shore well is a development that is compatible with the character of the area, where many other private waterfront properties have similar structures along the St. Lawrence River. The shore well will improve the site and add value to the property.

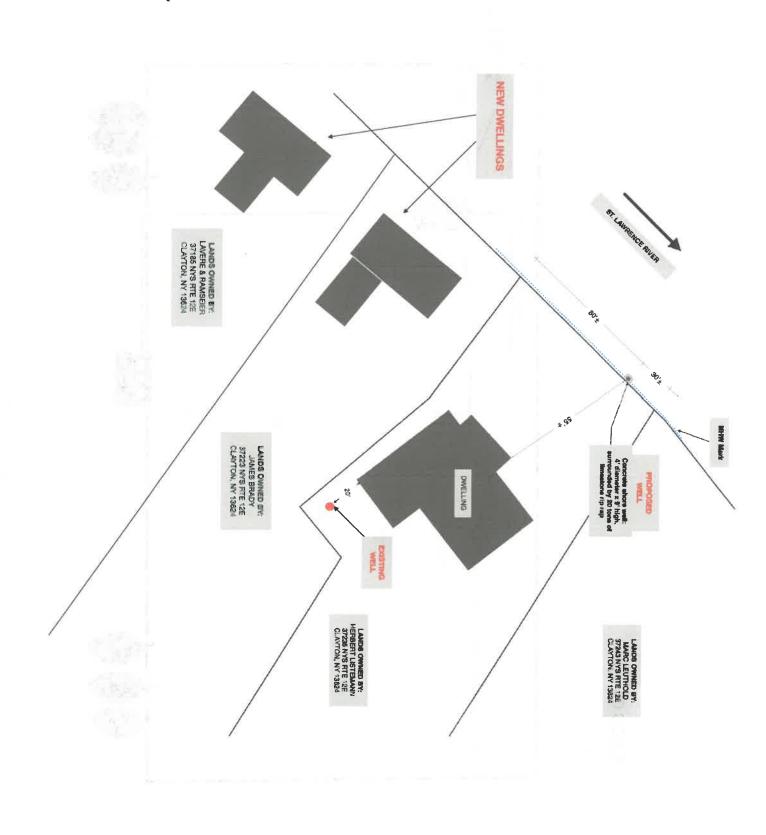

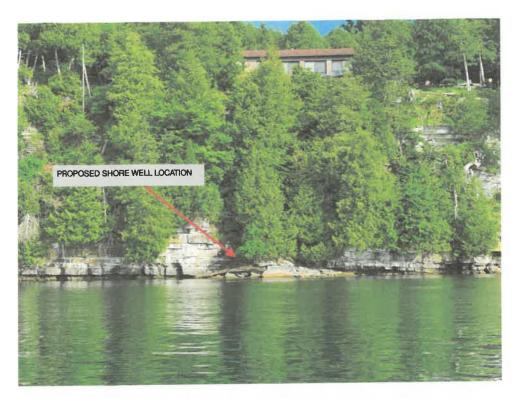

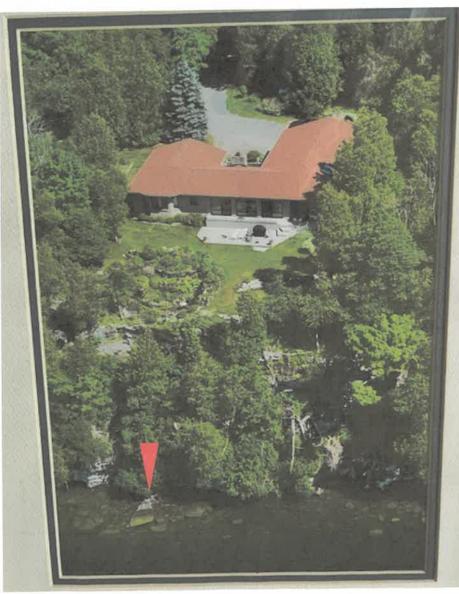
SHORE WELL FOR PRIVATE POTABLE WATER SOURCE

When the Town of Clayton issued certain bonds and notes with an Official Statement, it agreed to disclose information on a periodic and continuing basis to the investing public for the life of the issue, pursuant to the provisions of Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) Rule 15c2-12, as amended (the "Rule"). This information is described in the Disclosure Undertaking section of the issue's Official Statement.

Municipal Solutions, Inc. is submitting this proposal to the Town to assist with Continuing Disclosure filings and regulations pursuant to the Rule, which supersedes any prior disclosure filing currently in place. This information must be disclosed through filings on the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board's (MSRB) Electronic Municipal Market Access (EMMA) system, the Nationally Recognized Municipal Securities Information Repository (NRMSIR), in the following manners:

- **Limited Disclosure** Annual Financial Statement filings are required for original Serial Bond issues over \$1,000,000 sold with an Official Statement.
- Material Event Notice Filings are required anytime a material event occurs for any Note or Serial Bond issue sold with an Official Statement, whether over or under \$1,000,000. A listing of such Material Events can be found in each issue's Official Statement. These filings MUST occur within ten (10) days of such event per the Rule.
- **Full Disclosure** Statements of Annual Financial Information and Operating Data are required to be prepared and filed for original bond issues over \$1,000,000 prepared with an Official Statement, if at the time of issuance, the Town had \$10,000,000 or more of outstanding debt.

If a municipality fails to complete the required filings on the MSRB EMMA website, it is very unlikely that underwriters will bid on any future borrowings due to potential fines by the Securities Exchange Commission.

The Town will notify Municipal Solutions, Inc. immediately upon the occurrence or immediately upon the Town's knowledge of an occurrence of each Event or noncompliance with the Rule, and will immediately provide all information necessary for preparation of the notice of occurrence of each such Event or noncompliance with the Rule.

The Town shall review and provide approval of the content and form of all material event notices, with the exception of the following: bond or note calls, defeasances, rating changes and other required material event notices required to meet timely notice requirements. These exceptions will be filed automatically on the Town's behalf, unless the Town has notified Municipal Solutions, Inc. otherwise in writing.

DISCLOSURE OF CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board Rule G-42 requires us, as your municipal advisor, to provide written disclosure to you about material conflicts of interest.

We have determined, after exercising reasonable diligence, that we have no known material conflicts of interest that would impair our ability to provide advice to the Town in accordance with our fiduciary duty to municipal entity clients. The attached paragraphs outline areas of potential conflicts of interest we have reviewed to make this no material conflict of interest determination.

Our proposal includes compensation for municipal advisory activities to be performed that is contingent on the size or closing of any transaction as to which Municipal Solutions, Inc. is providing advice, the potential conflicts that could occur as a result of this pricing compensation are outlined below.

FORMS OF COMPENSATION AS POTENTIAL CONFLICTS

The forms of compensation for municipal advisors vary according to the nature of the engagement and requirements of the client, among other factors. Various forms of compensation present actual or potential conflicts of interest because they may create an incentive for an advisor to recommend one course of action over another if it is more beneficial to the advisor to do so. This document discusses various forms of compensation and the timing of payments to the advisor.

Fixed fee - Under a fixed fee form of compensation, the municipal advisor is paid a fixed amount established at the outset of the transaction. The amount is usually based upon an analysis by the client and the advisor of, among other things, the expected duration and complexity of the transaction and the agreed-upon scope of work that the advisor will perform. This form of compensation presents a potential conflict of interest because, if the transaction requires more work than originally contemplated, the advisor may suffer a loss. Thus, the advisor may recommend less time-consuming alternatives, or fail to do a thorough analysis of alternatives. There may be additional conflicts of interest if the municipal advisor's fee is contingent upon the successful completion of a financing, as described below.

Hourly fee - Under an hourly fee form of compensation, the municipal advisor is paid an amount equal to the number of hours worked by the advisor times an agreed-upon hourly billing rate.
